The state of public education is on the precipice of a bottomless chasm while the political winds are blowing at its back. In New York State, Mr. Cuomo is pushing for the opening of the New York State Constitution via a convention that will cost the taxpayers several hundreds of millions of dollars. Money that could be spent on shoring up fiscally strapped school districts such as our own. Instead of removing economically devastating unfunded mandates, the Governor continues to pave new roads for enlarging the reach of charter schools. In Washington, with the appointment of Education Secretary, Mrs. DeVos, the tone has been set for expanding the voucher system and, subsequently, charter schools. These positions only serve to push an elitist agenda: while both public and charter schools must accept children of all levels and abilities, only public schools are required to educate children with linguistic, physical or social disabilities. This is done by removing the mandates from the charter schools and imposing them only on the public schools.

All is not lost. We still have a say: write a note to your Federal Senators expressing your sentiments regarding Mr. Neil Gorsuch for the Supreme Court. As NYSUT members the [MAC](#) makes this an effortless task. To make your message even stronger reach out to family and friends living in other states. Explain to them that support for Mr. Gorsuch is support for a *right to work* nation. Thereby undercutting the rights of workers across this great country. To understand what this would entail, have them look at what happened to the municipal and state workers of Wisconsin and Michigan *including* the firefighters, policemen, teachers, and other professional state and local employees. The message to be sent is a simple one: "Do not vote in support of Mr. Gorsuch for Supreme Court Justice."

Now is the time for all good men and women to stand together against the tide that seeks to destroy workers' rights. In this era of grandiose talk of wall building, we should not forget the lessons of history: It was not a mortar shell that brought down the Berlin Wall, it was the work of a Polish coalminer who dared to unify his brothers and sisters to fight for the rights of workers everywhere in his country. It was the collective will of the people of East Berlin to brave the gates and walk past the guards that could have shot them in the back but chose to ban together and hold their fire for the common good. As educators we owe it to our families and our forefathers: those immigrants that came to this great land seeking streets paved with gold but quickly realizing that it would be they that were to build the streets.
